Control Technologies recognized for their outstanding support of employees serving in the Military

Williston, VT, June 1st 2010-Terry Reynolds and Alice Delosa receive on behalf of Control Technologies, Inc. (CTI) the ***Above and Beyond*** and ***Pro Patria*** award from the Vermont Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve (VT ESGR) for their outstanding support of CTI employees who have served and continue to serve in the United States Military.

Jim Burrows an employee of the Control Technologies Vermont location nominated CTI for the Freedom award, which is the highest national award presented to an employer. Of seven employers nominated in Vermont, Control Technologies was in the top two. As a result of their selection as a nominee, VT ESGR reviewed the nomination and found CTI exhibited special support to their citizen-soldiers, CTI received the Above and Beyond Award, this award is presented by the state ESGR field office for actions and support that exceed the requirements of the federal law, "USERRA" (Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Act.) The Above and Beyond Award is the next higher award in the hierarchy of in-state ESGR awards.

Control Technologies was also the recipient of the Pro Patria Award, the highest award that a state ESGR field office can present to an employer, the award is presented annually to the one employer in the state who has provided the most exceptional support of our national defense through leadership practices and personnel policies that support their employees who serve in the National Guard or Reserve.

Jim Burrows joined the Navy right out of High School in 1986. He spent ten years active duty in the Navy as a Nuclear Reactor Operator on a submarine. He left active duty and decided to stay in the Navy Reserves for another ten years. While in the Navy Reserves in 2002-2003 working for Control Technologies he was deployed to Kuwait as a member of Naval Coastal Warfare Group 1, Harbor Defense Command 114. In May of 2007, he was Direct Commissioned as an Officer in the Medical Service Corp in the Vermont Army National Guard. On December 10, 2009 he was again deployed, this time to Afghanistan as the Medical Platoon Leader of 1-172 CAV (MTN), 86 IBCT. He is currently a 1LT with twenty three years of service. Jim has been employed at Control Technologies for ten years and currently holds a position as a HVAC Automation Technician, supporting the NY City School Construction Authority.
